Orientation is at 8:30 a.m. followed by a walk around the wetland before settling down to work on **The Oahu Club** side of **Keawawa wetland**.

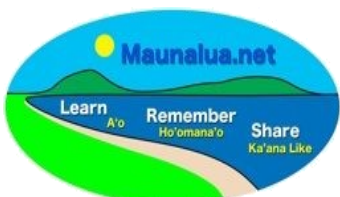


Keawāwa Wetland is a habitat for the endangered 'alae'ula (Hawaiian Moorhen).

This 5 acre heritage preserve includes a number of protect cultural sites, niu grove, dry stack well and native plants. Bring your camera as you may get a chance to spot the elusive water bird found only on Kaua'i and O'ahu.
